Motion was made by Councilmember Bowen to not support WAM Resolution No. 2023-07, A Resolution to Grant Municipalities the Authority to Condemn Abandoned Property on Private Real Property; seconded by Councilmember Quinn and unanimously approved by council.

No motion was made to support WAM Resolution No. 2023-08, A Resolution Granting Municipalities the Ability to Sell Municipal Owned Land to Developers for Housing. Resolution was not considered.

No motion was made to support WAM Resolution No. 2023-09, A Resolution Urging the Wyoming Associations of Municipalities to Continue Leading Statewide Efforts for action on Workforce Housing. Resolution was not considered.

Motion was made by Councilmember Price to support WAM Resolution No. 2023-10, A Resolution Supporting Legislation to Decriminalize Medical Marijuana; seconded by Councilmember Quinn. The mayor then called for the question. Those voting "Yea" were Councilmember Batista, Councilmember Bowen, Councilmember Hicks, Councilmember Price, and Councilmember Quinn.
