6. Ensure follow-through of City Council decisions
7. Chip seal and fog seal program—prevention
8. Prioritize impact funding money from TerraPower and understand what is coming
9. Storm drains—keep fixing missing, broken, sunken curb gutters—establish storm drain fund
10. Complete goal list from last year—progress updates
11. Promote economic growth and opportunity
12. Archie Neil Park Improvements (concrete in front of concessions, etc.)
13. Appropriate enforcement of codes and ordinances
14. More council, staff, and board trainings
